Scripture: James 1:22-25 NIV Life Application Study Bible

"Do not merely listen to the Word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like a man who looks at his face in the mirror and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like."

A Thought: There are countless times when we are exhilarated when the Word of God speaks to us - especially when things go swell. On the opposite end of the spectrum when times are tough we find ourselves not unlike our Exodus ancestors of Christendom...grumbling, muttering, whining and bellyaching. Forty years of wandering souls listening to the Word but not applying God's truth in their lives. Sound familiar? Oh yes, we faithfully attend Sunday services, even Wednesday evening studies. We may even tithe and possibly teach a weekly Bible study...true spiritual stewards of the Word. But like a light sheen on a fancy-looking piece of furniture the soft spiritual luster eventually fades away. Slowly to be sure. No fanfare. Our commitment to the Word creeps away like slow moving ominous clouds casting a shadow on our faithfulness. Subsequently the necessary and indispensable application of the Word does not take hold. James tells as much (1:25 NIV) "But the man who looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues to do this, not forgetting what he has heard, but doing it - he will be blessed in what he does."

Bottom Line:
